QUARTIER DES SPECTACLES

Generally quiet during Montréal's long hibernation period, at first blossoming in the spring, the city comes alive at its core, as it launches festival season and people return to the streets in droves. At the heart of so much collective activity, downtown oozes with anticipation and promise. While going from the MAC to the Théâtre Maisonneuve, or while walking to the Métropolis at night, witness how the area, also home to the red light district, takes on an entirely other, after hours flavour. Replete with characters, hustlers and tourists, this stretch of downtown also struts sophistication and sensuality with its media facades and playground sensibility.

Considered the trendiest neighbourhood in town, and often compared to Williamsburg in Brooklyn, it is home to world famous musicians, artists, and independent galleries and shops, not to mention some of the best ethnic and new creative food cultures.

TIP: The 80 Bus on Parc goes north to south every 10 minutes. To head north, catch it at the exit of Place des Arts metro on President Kennedy Avenue. Wait on Parc Avenue, pointing south to come back to MUTEK 15, and get off once you arrive at Place des Arts metro. At night the Bus changes to 365 Parc. Same route.
